This award distinguishes companies who demonstrate a strong commitment to implementing innovative and effective employee safety and health programs. The award was presented to the Goldsboro processing plant and hatchery during the 2014 National Safety Conference for the Poultry Industry. In addition, Case Farms' Winesburg, Ohio feed mill was presented the Award of Merit.
